Tournament Update Apalachicola

The Captains' meeting was held at Bay City Lodge where most of the club chose as home base. There was a good turnout and most all of the club members and a number of guests showed up to socialize and learn about the details of the tournament weigh-in schedule. Good amounts of beer, tacos, and oysters were consumed and enjoyed by all.



Bay City has a very laid back vibe and the units are comfortable. Nothing to brag about, but a wonderful price performer where a 2 bedroom / 2 bath unit with a slip included cost \$145/night. This unit sleeps 4 people in the 2 bedrooms and the cost is very reasonable.

The weather on Thursday June 7th was beautiful but it went downhill the balance of the week.

8 of 9 boats weighed fish in on Friday. As the weather turned worse on Saturday, fewer boats went offshore and fewer fish were caught. *Slipaway* (Lewis Woodruff) had a run of bad luck on the mechanical front that stopped them from fishing.

Outlaw - Mike Springer had a nice spread of red snappers running 30+ miles day one and 40+ miles day two. The weather was so rough on day two, it left Team *Outlaw* with long slow runs and left little time to fish. They spent 3 hrs riding out to fish just 1 hr

and spent 3+hrs coming back in. Several lightning strikes hit extremely close to *Outlaw*. Squall line came through interrupting the fishing. Luckily, the fish were waiting on them when they arrived at their spots.

Unfortunately, on the way back in,



Outlaw took a big wave over the bow and it blew out his isinglass in front of the helm. The decision to run out forty miles through the storms on day two paid off for *Outlaw* by winning the tournament. Steve Fritz was on fire with the big Red Snappers both Day 1 and Day 2 at the weigh in. Largest Red Snapper and largest weighed fish was an 18lb stop sign Red which Fritz caught.

Nikki Girl - Pat Thai and Lenny fished the first day out of Indian Pass and had a great day of fishing with nice Red Grouper and Snapper. The water pump failed on the *Nikki Girl* and they replaced it in the driveway of their cabin at Bay City Lodge on Saturday (they were seen working on it that morning as the rest of the group pondered the weather). So they didn't make it out in time to weigh any fish, which is too bad because they were tied for first on day 1.

Close Cut - Steve Anglin fished on his boat *Close Cut* (he's a barber), also out of Indian Pass and they did very well with a nice take of Red Grouper and Snappers. His Red Groupers were extra large. He had a Jr. Angler Jered Kebbe, who caught a king around 6 lbs. Day 2 and won the \$50 Junior Angler Big Fish Prize. They didn't make it out because it was too rough on day two, choosing safety over fishing rough water that could "put the hurt on you". The Junior Angler got seasick on day 1 but shook it off and enjoyed the tournament.



Bad Buoys - Jace Spencer on *Bad Buoys* took his sons Jonathan and Kendall and they pre-fished on Thursday catching a 30+ lb. Black Drum. Awesome catch on light tackle which Jace indicated was a 10+ minute fight. Despite the gloomy forecast, Jace and the boys ventured out about 10 miles on Friday with good friend Gene Payne along for the bumpy ride. Seas were building during the day Fri-



day and after just a short while at anchor over the St George Bridge rubble, the decision was made to head in, even though the bite was on.

There was way too much water on the wrong side of the boat (the top side), so with a



mixed bag including 6 snappers in the box, they tunneled north through the waves to finish the day fishing inshore. Saturday was another inshore day, cut short by storms. Their goal was to get 4 Sea Trout and then try for some slot reds. They completed the Sea Trout portion of the plan before the



weather turned ugly. The Sea Trout weighed in each day definitely contributed to their high points standing.



Two Bills weighed in a nice mixed bag of fish on day 1 (13 lb Red Snapper,

3 nice Gags, 9 lbs for the biggest, a Red Grouper, a Trigger, and a Mangrove) and chose to come in a bit early when the weather started to turn worse. On Day 2, they chose not to push it and kept close to shore.

Where to Next? Team enjoyed a great Thursday of pre-fishing. Proving that some “magic numbers” aren’t always what people claim they are, day 1 of the Tournament started great with a nice ride out to Enterprise Mica which produced a few fish. Nothing great. We trolled south for a couple hours in beautiful blue water but couldn’t stir up anything but a short strike on the shotgun line. We did find a nice artificial reef which produced a bunch of nice fish, but decided to leave when the lighting showed up and began walking in mile by mile. Ride in was with sloppy wind-driven waves on the bow, so it was a rough 2.5+hr ride in to make weigh-in. Day 2 Capt Mozena decided safety was more important than pushing for the tournament win, so we cleaned fish, cleaned the boat, and took the opportunity to fish inshore drifting the bridge pilings. The team boated some spotted trout so they scored points on both days. Just not enough points to make the podium.



Fish Tail II had a nice catch of Spanish and Mangrove Snapper on Day one. Patti Wilkins weighed two huge Mangrove Snapper 8.3 and 8.4 lbs which was 1 oz. under the club record and will go a long way in her bid for Lady Angler of the year.

Insurman (Keith Dillon) had a good day of fishing on day one with limits of Red Snapper and Red Grouper. They added a King to this haul for a pretty good day. They had one Red Grouper that just made the 50 point mark, caught by Drew.

Lewis Woodruff *Slipaway* attended his first club tournament at Apalachicola. He was burdened with both problems including issues with his motor, electronics, and trailer. He called to mention what a great time he had and we also acknowledged him at the awards giving him a hat donated from Capt. Snook’s.

The raffle was held at the Awards Dinner at Captain Snook’s in Eastpoint. 5 different prizes were awarded



by drawing. Mike Springer ended up with the winning raffle ticket for the Shimano spinning rod, reel, and full reel of braid.

Tournament Update Orange Beach

From Monday through Friday, the weather offshore couldn't have been much better for the 7 fishing boats of the Atlanta Saltwater Sportsman's Club that participated in the July 8th through 14th week-long tournament. Although there were occasional thunderstorms, the seas generally were 1 to 2 feet, which meant a nice breeze to help keep the heat away.

Before the fishing got started, there was time for a mini raft up to enjoy Robinson Island.



The fishing was absolutely great, especially with the extension of the red snapper season to July 17th, which allowed everyone to catch them until the end of the tournament. Many big snappers were brought to the weigh-in each day and Sam Hyland, *fishing on Where to Next?*, brought in the biggest one of the tournament at 18.4lbs. What was great was that you didn't have to travel very far offshore to catch them, with some folks catching sows just 7 miles off the beach. Sam caught his in 280ft of water 40 miles out.

Competition was tight after the first Monday, with the girls on *Outlaw* leading the pack, but after that *Pam's Competition* took the lead and



never looked back, finishing with an outstanding 2-day catch of over 1200 points. The next three competitors were stacked close together but could not top the consistent catching by the team on *Pam's Competition*. Their biggest point day was from an overnight trip that saw grouper, scamp, red snapper, king, tuna, dolphin and other various fish that totaled in the hundreds of pounds. With so many species of fish being weighed, the point total was huge. Cleaning all that fish took the crew hours the next morning, but it was well worth it as everyone on the boat brought home enough fish to fill their freezers.

Second place went to *Bad Buoys* with an awesome display of consistent catching, taking advantage of the great weather and calm water to push out to deeper water in Jace's 22ft Everglades. Jace and his boys were tough to catch with daily points totals climbing each day. Third place went to *Fish Tale Too*, who was only 10 points behind *Bad Buoys* when the counting was done. This shows how competitive this OBA tournament was.



A notable fish caught, which garnered the Big Fish of the Tournament went to Richard Watkins fishing with the guys on *Where to Next?*. Richard caught this nice slob of bull Mahi, which weighed in at 28 lbs., with a blue and white islander rigged with a single hook and medium ballyhoo. This stud provided the *Where to Next?* crew with a great show of several jumps and flips before he was gaffed and dropped in the box. Captain Mozena was in the role of gaff man and helped Richard out by gaffing the billboard of a Mahi right behind the gills so as not to damage the good sized filets Richard

was able to cut off of him.

Another notable catch was this giant Redfish, caught and released while bottom fishing out in deep water. This was one of the last fish expected while bottom fishing nowhere near an inlet. This fish put up a respectable fight even on heavy bottom gear and was a nice break in the heated bottom fishing action.

Speaking of horrible weather, it was mentioned that the weather Monday through Friday was outstanding but by Saturday, it had turned the complete opposite, just in time for the Blue Angels Air Show. Winds Saturday were gusting to 20 knots plus and bands of showers and squall lines raced ashore with regularity. Not to be scared off by the weather, 5 boats traveled from Orange Beach to the Santa Rosa bay behind Pensacola Beach, hoping the air show would somehow go on. What a trip it was. Every boat, of different sizes and shapes, from pontoon boats to 60 foot battle wagons, filled the back channels and Intracoastal Waterway, since the winds had 4-6 foot seas stirred up offshore. Just way too rough to make a pleasant ride for all. Everyone across the panhandle, it seemed, had the same idea to use the “calm water” to make it to the airshow. However, between the wakes from the larger boats, intermittent blinding rain, and the chop and spray from the wind, it was indeed a hair-raising trip. The ASWSC managed to get 4 of our 5 boats rafted up in a great spot behind the new Ferris wheel of Pensacola Beach. *Pam's Competition*, *Where to Next?*, *Outlaw*, and *Shuffle Truffle* made our group for the afternoon. We put up our American Flags and the new ATL Saltwater Sportsman's Club teardrop flags so everyone could know we were there.



Fish Tale Two was our missing boat, who lost communications on the way over, and couldn't find the main Atlanta group. The four boats remained at anchor for a couple hours, enjoying each others company and food. Several intermittent rain bands came through and caused everyone to go under cover the best they could until the rains blew past. The early air show acts were cancelled but the weather broke enough for the Blue Angels to perform for approximately an hour. They performed their “low altitude” show with all of the acrobatics centered over the Pensacola Beach Pier area as usual. So we couldn't see everything, but many times the jets screamed right over our heads in Santa Rosa Bay providing great excitement and entertainment for all. mala, Costa Rica, Panama to name a few countries. Ben will share with us the techniques used, gear used, alternative approaches to rigging used in Central America, and locations to consider.


