Fishlips! ASWSC returned to Destin for the annual Duel at Destin over the Labor Day weekend. Weather and sea conditions were perfect and accommodations at Pirates Bay are hard to beat with the low rate and boat slip and trailer storage

included. One significant improvement this year was having the daily weigh-in at the new water front restaurant Fishlips under Brooks Bridge. When's the last time vou had а band playing weigh-in? It's also



pretty cool seeing the crowds gather as our boats pulled up to the scale.

Fishing *Easy Does It* style: Thursday we decided to hit it hard and fish offshore. Mike had a hot tip on an amberjack spot. After gassing up the boat, breakfast at Waffle House, stop by Publix for lunch, launch the boat, and we were off the dock before 11:00. We found a nice weed line and caught and released dolphin for hours. We kept a few for dinner. The amberjack bite didn't work out for us, but we did manage a few nice kings.

The *Where to Next*? team found the hot wahoo bite out near the Ozark and weighed in four really nice ones in the twenty to thirty five pound range. *Lured Away* also went to blue water but decided to fish late rather than make the weighin.



On day two the *Easy Does It* team wasn't quite as ambitious and got a late start. We had trouble catching bait, so the mission was aborted; instead, we had lunch at Fishlips and spent the rest of the day on Crab Island. *Instigator* found the amberjack with the big fish of the day at just under thirty pounds. *Lured Away* had the tuna touch, weighing in a nice pair of blackfin. *Nikki Girl* also had a nice blackfin. Nikki's 18.9 pound tuna ended up being the top junior angler catch.

On day three, the Easy Does It team decided to

put in a solid half-day effort. Steve even sprung for \$4 worth of cigar minnows as backup. We made the five mile run to our secret spot, caught a couple of nice kings and Spanish, then to Dewy Destin's by lunch. We spent the rest of the day on Crab Island. *Where to Next?* fished the popular area now called Darrin's Daisy and had a pair of slammer dolphin to prove it. Bad Buoys wore out the juniors with a box full of grouper, snapper and trigger fish.

The tournament concluded at Olive Garden for the Awards Banquet. Steve Fritz presented the awards and the big fish rewards generously provided by Lenny Pisarski. Many Thanks to our local supporters, including Pirates Bay, Half Hitch, and Fishlips.

Third Time's the Charm Apalachicola Tournament Report

The seas could have been a little more friendly, but at least we were able to get offshore both days. I was invited to fish aboard *Nikki Girl* with Captain Pat Thai and crewmembers Gene Payne & Vladamir Melnik. Pat always finds fish and I always have a good trip on his boat, so of course I jumped at the chance.



On Friday we got an early start, heading out of Bay City in the pre-dawn darkness. We made a not-soquick stop to buy some pinfish at the Cut and, after barely managing to transfer the bait and money without any injuries or collisions inside the rough inlet, we headed out to one of the local towers. We trolled a bit on our approach and caught a large spanish, then we latched on with the rig hook and tried our hand at bottom fishing. We caught a few snappers of various types, including a couple of respectable reds, but the really big ones eluded us. We moved on to another tower and repeated the process. We picked up a few more fish, and were disappointed by a few amberjack that were just under legal size. Afterwards, we made a run south to one of Capt Pat's secret spots and caught 4 beautiful red grouper. Unfortunately, they too were all *just* under legal size. We had long and bumpy ride back in,



made a quick stop at an inshore spot to catch our one seatrout for the day, then on to the weigh-in, where we found ourselves in 3rd place out of the three boats that chose to weigh in that day. Ted DuBose on *Glory Days* had a good day and was in first place. Bill Rhodes on Two Bills was close behind. Some tired anglers headed for hot showers and a good meal, followed closely by some muchneeded sleep.

We decided to avoid stumbling around in the dark Saturday morning and left a little bit later. We invested an hour or so inshore and again only managed one seatrout for our efforts. Then we headed out to Empire Mica. We found Two Bills already anchored and finishing up their limit of red snapper. Capt Rhodes also reported catching a nice king (which eventually weighed in at 42.6 lbs and turned out to be the big fish of the tournament). Over the next few hours, we managed to limit out on red snapper as well, but no kings or any other really 'big uns' for us. We had an even bumpier and wetter 35mile ride back in, having to slow down so much that at first we were concerned about making the weighin. Luckily, the seas calmed a bit as the afternoon wore on and we were able to pick up speed, even having time to stop and catch 5 spanish mackerel on the way.



Things had changed when we arrived at the weighin Saturday; *Two Bills* had rocketed into first place with his outstanding catch. *Glory Days* had taken a conservative approach with the questionable conditions; after our catch was weighed in, *Nikki Girl* had edged into 2nd Place by 5 points (which made for a humorous round of good-natured jabs and playful bragging). Jason Craig and his crew aboard *Truffle Shuffle* also participated in the tournament and caught some nice fish, but did not make either weigh-in.

Bay City Lodge Restaurant hosted our Awards Dinner and we shared the details of our exploits while enjoying some good food and cold beverages. The Big Fish Reward of \$100, supplied by Lenny Pisarski, was awarded to Bill Rhodes for his monster king mackerel. No junior anglers this trip.



I had a great time and I'm pretty sure most everyone else did, too.
