I fished with Frank Nicoletti on *Lured Away*, along with my brother-in-law Bill Woodcock (Woody) and new member Gene Payne. We arrived a day early and fished on Thursday. In my many years of fishing, I've never experienced what we did on That day. We fished the Timber Holes and had the typical catch of Red Snapper, Kings, AJs and other miscellaneous species. Then we had the strangest thing happen. A pod of Dolphins - maybe 6 - had been hanging around and before you know it they started grabbing our catches when we were bringing them up. They finally took about 6 of our catches when Frank ended up hooking one and it was off to the races... Hard to stop an 800 pound Dolphin, Frank cut the line as it raced off his reel. Never seen that before. What's up with that???

Friday morning turned out to be a bit windy, so went our plans to go a long way off shore. The bait man didn't have any live bait, so we caught our own at the pass. We fished a few spots close in and worked our way out to the Timber Holes again.

That place has always been good to us. We picked up the usual fare of Snapper, Kings, small Triggers (need to be 14 inch now), along with a couple of nice Lane Snapper and B-liners.

Back at the weigh-in, we pulled in behind Ted and *Glory Days*. They had a mess of fish - isn't that just like Ted? Mike Springer pulled in also; they didn't do a lot of fishing, but enjoyed themselves at Crab Island.



Saturday morning was looking good and a lot of action at the pass getting bait. We chose to buy ours from the bait man and headed out to the Ozark. We arrived and Bill Rhodes was already working the spot, catching mostly small AJ's. We started in the drift pattern and picked up a few Sharks and small AJ's. After that Frank took us to one of his honey holes---don't ask me where. Anyway, we caught a bunch of Snapper and Gene hooked up a nice Cobia that had been hanging around. I almost lost it at the boat and did manage to lose that small gaff--I owe you one Frank. Woody took over and gaffed him into the boat. Turned out to be 19 pounds - not bad for your first club tournament, Gene.

Back at the weigh-in, I was hoping Gene's Cobia would be the Big Fish of the tournament, but Scott Rowe had a big grin on his face as they carried his Wahoo to the scale, yes he did. I have to give credit to his boat captain. Ted ran off shore when the seas laid down in the afternoon and only trolled a short time before the Wahoo hit. Nice going guys.

In case you didn't know, they came to the tournament and only fished a little, and spent most of their time preparing our meals... Great Club Supporters - Thanks Guys. 
