To reserve slip call or email Dave, tell him you are with the ASWSC for the rates. (You probably want to also say it is for the tournament Chuck Alford set up)

- The Marina rates for this event are \$1.50/ft per night, and that includes launching and trailer storage.
- The Marina has fuel and ice open 24hrs and a ships store with some tackle and bait.
- Half Hitch Tackle is 2 miles down the road
- There is a twice the ice at Half Hitch, and one between there and the Marina (this one takes credit cards), and to be honest I like the convenience of buying ice at the marina and I think it is harder and last longer.
- There is a bait barge to the right as you head out to the pass that sells Cigar Minnows and Pinfish, (.75 cents each as of June)

Awards Banquet 7:30 PM Saturday:

Pier 77 Restaurant 3016 Thomas Dr, Panama City Beach, FL 32408

Right on Thomas Dr out of the Marina and Pier 77 is a mile or so on the left. I need a good head count of attendees a week ahead and the meal selection by the Captain's meeting. The available menu selection will be sent out ahead of time.

Where to Stay:

There are literally hundreds of condos, most available for rent, within a couple of miles of the marina. (Google PCB condo rentals Thomas Dr, the "big bend" where Thomas Dr turns and follows the beach is the area to look in). The 3 largest condos nearby are Treasure Island, The Commodore and Moonspinner, and Venture Out (not condos but many rentals) but there are many smaller sets of condos also, some on the beach and many a block off the beach and cheaper. Lots of rental management companies and lots of VRBO.

There is a Hampton Inn a mile away, La Quinta a couple miles away and a Fairfield Suite and Hawthorn Inn about 4 miles away, and if you like to camp, St Andrews State Park is about 3 miles away and is very nice.

Suggestion: If you are worried about being able to do a late cancellation, reserve one of the hotels, and when the weather looks good a few days ahead of time you should be able to get a last minute condo on the beach since this is off season.

What to Expect:

- PCB has probably around 150 artificial reefs, many of them pretty big. You can download the Bay County reefs online, but your best source is the Half Hitch chart, along with the numbers you can see the layout.
 - What it does not have is the Mexico Beach reefs, there are a lot of reef pyramids 25 miles out, look at mbara.org
- There are some live bottom areas starting about 15 miles from the pass.
- The Madison and Swanson area is almost as close to here as it is to Apalachicola, so the fishing areas around it are 50 – 60 miles.
- Amberjack season opens August 1st and the PCB area has dozens of large relief artificial reefs that are covered in AJ. You may have to wrestle 5 or 10 to get a legal one, but there are worse things in life.
- Triggerfish are closed - Thanks FWC
- There are Redfish, Trout and Flounder in the bays.
- There will be King and Spanish Mackerel around. The Kings are all up and down the beach from a mile to 40 miles out. Spanish are in the Bay as well as nearshore.
- You never know when a Cobia or Blackfin will surprise you and sometimes you find peanut Dolphin not too far offshore hanging under something floating.
- Grouper will be open, there are a few but not a lot of Grouper in this area without getting 40 miles out or so.
- Red Snapper is closed, but Vermillion are everywhere and there is the occasional Mangrove.
